WHAT: Announce a release concert & science fair for their new album *Mighty Wolf* - A Musical Exploration of Science and Nature for Kids

WHERE: Glenn Miller Ballroom -1669 Euclid Ave., on the CU-Boulder campus

WHEN: Sunday, Nov. 1, 2015 from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

WHY: *Mighty Wolf* brings science concepts -- insect migration, arctic animal adaptations and keystone species -- to life. Named after their son, Wolf (born Nov. 9th, 2014), *Mighty Wolf* is filled with nature appreciation, irresistible musical hooks and catchy, clever lyrics for all ages. Each song is instructive, but never preachy.

ETC: Age-appropriate for 3-9 year olds as well as adults, who love silliness and the great outdoors. Concert begins at 4 p.m. where you will hear:

- *Two ladybugs performing a heartfelt duet about their love of aphids and their role as pest control for farms;*
- *A hungry raven singing his hungry heart out about roadkill;*
- *A bolt of lightning crooning about staying safe in a raging thunderstorm;*
- *The beautiful ballad of Grandma Gatewood, the first woman ever to hike the Appalachian Trail!*

- * *Try your hand at chromatography to create a beautiful butterfly for the Great Monarch Migration!*
